

Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinics

Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinics (CCBHCs) are community clinics that offer integrated mental health and substance use disorder services, as well as a range of other services. These clinics provide outreach, increase access, improve services and serve as a "one-stop-shop" to a wide range of community members, regardless of ability to pay.

About CCBHCs

Navigating mental health and substance use disorder systems can be difficult. Typically, a person with a mental illness will need to contact several different agencies to obtain a different level of care, and rarely can someone obtain both mental health and substance use disorder treatment through the same agency.

CCBHCs improve Minnesotans' access to treatment through a model of community clinics that provide comprehensive, coordinated and integrated care to children and adults with complex mental health and substance use disorders.

High-level care coordination and partnerships between providers, social services agencies, counties and other key stakeholders increases the likelihood that care is received before a person enters into crisis. This improves outcomes and saves money by diverting care from emergency rooms.

Integrated care

People who use CCBHCs may receive:

- Outpatient mental health and substance use services
- Primary care screening and monitoring
- Screening, assessment and diagnosis, including risk management
- Psychiatric rehabilitation services
- Crisis mental health services, including 24-hour mobile crisis teams, emergency crisis intervention services and crisis stabilization
- Person-centered and family-centered treatment planning
- Targeted case management
- Peer and family support
- Services for veterans and members of the armed forces
- Care coordination with other providers and systems.

History of CCBHCs

In 2014, Congress established a demonstration project to test CCBHCs, and Minnesota was one of eight states to pilot the clinics. These clinics continue to grow in Minnesota and across the nation.

PHASE 1 – FEDERAL DEMONSTRATION

Oct. 2015: Minnesota selected for federal planning grant

Oct. 2016: Six CCBHCs certified in Minnesota

PHASE 2 – SUSTAINABILITY PLANNING

July 1, 2017: Demonstration begins

Jan. 2020: Minnesota develops its first strategic plan for CCBHC sustainability

Oct. 2020: CCBHC services become a Medicaid-covered benefit statewide

Oct. 2020: Two CCBHCs previously funded by SAMHSA grants achieve state certification, are now paid by Medicaid

PHASE 3 – DEEPENING REACH AND IMPACT

June 2022: Minnesota has 13 CCBHCs funded by Medicaid and seven CCBHCs funded by SAMHSA grants, for a total of 20 CCBHCs.


