# Vulnerable Adult Maltreatment Dashboard Data Description

#### Data Source: DHS Data Warehouse

Data is generated from a working database, as a result, numbers can change over time due to data cleanup and requirements for data destruction after 3 years.

#### **Data Explanation**

The Minnesota Adult Abuse Reporting Center (MAARC) is the state centralized common entry point for mandated reporters and the public to report adults who are vulnerable and suspected of having been abused, neglected, or financially exploited. All reports made to MAARC are referred to the agency responsible to respond. Minnesota encourages reporting based on a standard of suspicion and accepts all reports.

#### Step One: Report

Suspected abuse, neglect, or financial exploitation is reported to MAARC.

Total Reports is the total number of adult maltreatment reports received by MAARC.

**Total Allegations** is the total number of allegations reported within the adult maltreatment reports received by MAARC. Each allegation type is counted once per report.

Allegation types include:

- **Caregiver Neglect:** Failure by a caregiver to provide an adult, who is vulnerable, with the care or services necessary to maintain their health.
- **Emotional Abuse:** Conduct that is not an accident or therapeutic and produces, or could reasonably be expected to produce, emotional distress.
- **Financial Exploitation (fiduciary):** Unauthorized spending and/or failure to spend the funds of an adult, who is vulnerable, for the adult's benefit when the person alleged responsible has a financial relationship/obligation to the adult. *(theft, fraud, coercion, undue influence, or scam by a power-of-attorney, conservator, trustee, payee, or other fiduciary)*
- Financial Exploitation (non-fiduciary): Unauthorized spending and/or failure to spend the funds of an adult, who is vulnerable, for the adult's benefit when the person alleged responsible does not have a financial relationship/obligation to the adult. *(theft, fraud, coercion, undue influence, or scam)*
- **Physical Abuse:** Conduct that is not an accident or therapeutic and produces, or could reasonably be expected to produce, physical pain or injury. *(hitting, slapping, kicking, punishment)*
- **Self Neglect:** Failure by an adult, who is vulnerable, to meet the needs essential to maintain the adult's health, safety, or comfort.
- **Sexual Abuse:** Contact or interaction of a sexual nature involving an adult, who is vulnerable, without their agreement, any sexual interaction with a licensed provider, or criminal sexual conduct against an adult who is vulnerable.



#### Step Two: Refer

MAARC refers the report to the agency responsible. The agency responsible is required to review the report and decide how to respond.

The agencies include:

- **County Adult Protective Services (APS):** is responsible when the report of suspected maltreatment does not involve a facility or service required to be licensed by DHS Licensing or the Department of Health. *(family, friend, personal care assistant (PCA), scam, unknown person, self-neglect)*
- **DHS Licensing:** is responsible when the report of suspected maltreatment involves a facility or service required to be licensed by the Department of Human Services. *(adult day care, adult foster care, programs for people with disabilities, substance use disorders, sex offender programs)*
- **MN Department of Health (MDH):** is responsible when the report of suspected maltreatment involves a facility or service required to be licensed by the Department of Health for the care of adults who are vulnerable. *(hospitals, home care providers, nursing homes, hospice providers)*

**Agency Reports** is the total number of adult maltreatment reports, MAARC received in the calendar year, by the agency responsible to respond.

**Total Agency Reports** may include duplicate counts when more than one agency is responsible for a single report. As a result, the Step Two - Refer, "Agency Reports" total, will not match the "Total Reports" total in Step One - Report.

**Agency Allegations** is the total number of allegations referred to the agency responsible to respond. Each allegation type is counted once per report received by the agency responsible. However, Total Agency Allegations may include duplicate counts when more than one agency is responsible for the same report. As a result, the Step Two - Refer, "Agency Allegations" total, will not match the "Total Allegation" total in Step One - Report.

#### Step Three: Response

Each report is reviewed by the agency responsible to make decisions on how to respond to the report and protect the vulnerable adult.

**Agency Reports** is the total number of adult maltreatment reports, MAARC received in the calendar year, by the agency responsible to respond.

**Total Agency Reports** may include duplicate counts when more than one agency is responsible for a single report. As a result, the Step Two - Refer, "Agency Reports" total, will not match the "Total Reports" total in Step One - Report

**Accepted for Investigation** is the total number of reports the agency responsible received in the calendar year that met requirements for investigation.



#### Step Three: Response

Each report is reviewed by the agency responsible to make decisions on how to respond to the report and protect the vulnerable adult.

**Agency Reports** is the total number of adult maltreatment reports, MAARC received in the calendar year, by the agency responsible to respond.

**Total Agency Reports** may include duplicate counts when more than one agency is responsible for a single report. As a result, the Step Two - Refer, "Agency Reports" total, will not match the "Total Reports" total in Step One - Report

**Accepted for Investigation** is the total number of reports the agency responsible received in the calendar year that met requirements for investigation.

#### **Step Four: Determination**

The agency makes a determination for every report that meets the requirements for investigation.

**County APS** investigates by gathering facts and engages adults in assessment and service interventions to stop, reduce risk or prevent maltreatment regardless of the agency's determination.

**DHS Licensing/MDH** investigate and regulate licensed providers and may take action for service quality and safety of adults, who are vulnerable, regardless of the agency's determination.

Determinations include:

- True: allegation of maltreatment occurred
- False: allegation of maltreatment did not occur
- **Inconclusive:** unable to be determined if maltreatment occurred
- **No Determination:** allegation was not able to be investigated, or the adult referred was determined by the agency not to be vulnerable.

**Determination** totals represent the number of determinations the agency made in the calendar year by determination type.



#### **Data Limitations**

- Each report is for one (1) adult. A report may reflect more than one (1) adult if the incident impacted more than five (5) adults.
- Maltreatment allegation types are counted once per report when multiple person/providers are alleged responsible.
- A single allegation may reflect multiple incidents of maltreatment.
- A single incident may reflect multiple allegations.
- Not all incidents reported and referred to an agency for response meet the legal definition of maltreatment.
- Not all adults reported and referred to an agency for response meet the legal definition of vulnerable.
- Agency determinations may be made in a different calendar year than the year in which the report was received.
- APS may not close for protective services in the same calendar year the determination was made.
- Data entry errors may occur.
