The mission of Collaboratives is to coordinate and integrate resources and services for children, youth, and families who face complex problems and are involved with multiple service systems.

In 2022, there were 90 Children's Mental Health and Family Services Collaboratives serving communities in 83 counties across Minnesota. This infographic highlights and summarizes Collaboratives' efforts, funding, and spending in 2022. Major Accomplishments

In 2022, Collaboratives shared about their major accomplishments that led to improved outcomes for children, youth, and families in their communities.



A school-based mental health provider was hired to meet the growing needs of youth. - Big Stone County Collaborative



In 2022, the Collaborative Board identified truancy as a major issue impacting youth in Goodhue County, so the Collaborative pulled together a workgroup of various stakeholders to use a model of improvement to make changes in the truancy process. - Goodhue County Child and Family Collaborative



Responding to an acute increase in gun violence among youth in 2022, the Collaborative shifted its priorities to provide funding for community healing and wellness activities among families, neighbors, and communities. - Hennepin County Children's Mental Health Collaborative



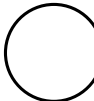
Each school district recruited a parent representative and school board member each to join the Collaborative, and these members are all committed and actively participating. - Koochiching County Family Collaborative



Our Collaborative was successful in braiding multiple funding streams together to help offset the costs of school-based social work positions embedded in the school districts. - Pennington County Collaborative



Our Board changed our bylaws to add two youth representatives as full voting members. We provide training to the youth board members, as well as extra support and outreach, to ensure they feel engaged and that they understand the materials we discuss in our board meetings. - Ramsey: Saint Paul Children's Collaborative



In 2022, we were able to get our Circle of Parents program up and running again after a pause due to the pandemic. The parents provided support to one another on various topics and were able to connect through Circle of Parents each week. - Todd County Family Services Collaborative for Children and Families
