

## Vulnerable Adult Lead Investigative Agency Determination Chart *(Original Effective Date: 2/12/2015)* last revised: 9/13/24, Published: 10/14/24

- MDH or DHS are the LIA when the alleged perpetrator is related to the provider/program/service licensed by MDH/DHS.
- When the allegation involves a vulnerable adult who receives services from MDH or DHS, but the alleged perpetrator is not related to a MDH or DHS licensed provider/program/service. County is LIA.
- Determine if an allegation of caregiver neglect should be included in the report when the allegation is self-neglect and the VA is residing in a facility.

  - i. If answers are not the same for each perpetrator, LIA = Manual
  - ii. If answers are the same for each perpetrator, look at the Vulnerable Adult screen and follow rules under step #1.
