Dept. of Children, Youth, and Families, Child Safety and Permanency presentation on Family First Prevention Services Act (FFPSA): (30 mins)</p>	<p>Laura not in meeting Sarah Barth presentation with assistance of Miquela H Via PowerPoint FFPSA</p> <div data-bbox="440 890 1393 978"><h3>Prevention Services- Overview</h3></div> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Eligibility under FFPSA prevention:<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Children who are at imminent risk of removal, candidates for foster care• Parents and caregivers of children who are candidates• Pregnant (expectant) and parenting youth in foster care• Services:<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Mental health, substance abuse, in-home parent skill-based programs• Kinship navigator programs• Evidence Criteria:<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Well-supported, supported, promising• Clearinghouse continues to rate programs• The FFPSA gives state, county and tribal child welfare agencies the ability to receive Title IV-E reimbursement for federally approved evidence-based services for children at imminent risk of out-of-home placement and their caregivers.<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Service categories:<ul style="list-style-type: none">• In-home parent skill-based programs• Mental health• Substance abuse• Available to children or youth who are candidates for prevention services, pregnant or parenting youth in foster care, and the parents or kin caregivers of those children and youth.

- Improve the health and well-being of families
- Reduce maltreatment and keep children with their families
- Reduce initial entry and re-entry into foster care
- Respond to and eliminate the disproportionate number of American Indian and African American children in Minnesota’s child protection system
- Strengthen and standardize expectations for Minnesota’s child welfare safety practices
- Expand service availability and array in a culturally responsive and coordinated way; and
- Create an accessible and sustainable system of family preservation services that strengthens families and improves outcomes for child(ren).

- ✓ Child safety must be monitored during the 12-month period.
- ✓ Periodic risk assessments must occur throughout the 12-month period.
- ✓ A prevention plan (service plan) must be developed for each child/family.
- ✓ Re-determination of eligibility after 12 months of services.
- ✓ Federal reporting requirements also exist, including tracking post-service delivery to 12 months
